

# Hill double their tally

LEAVING it to the final weekend of the County Championships the Box Hill Swim Team doubled their medal tally bringing the total to 20 which included seven gold.

The small club finished 11th from 23 in the combined team scores table well above many larger programmes with better resources.

For the first time in its short history the Box Hill team won medals in the relay events proving that they have depth as well as talent.

The girls nine - 11yrs medley team of Zoe Lyon, Millie Reed, Tabi Read-Cayton and Eve Williams won silver while later with Megan McInnes replacing Millie Reed they won another silver medal in the 4 x 50m freestyle relay event.

The previous day saw Tabi Read-Cayton rise to

the top girl spot in Surrey from 54 competitors as she completed four events winning gold in three.

Team mate Eve Williams moved into third position in the same age group taking silver in two events.

Despite disappointment in her earlier events Carrie Bonnar, nine, proved what a talented swimmer she is by storming to victory in the 50m breaststroke and 50m butterfly to become County Champion.

Once again Box Hill Swim Team Coach Conrad Cawley was full of praise for his team.

He said: "We work hard but put the emphasis on skill and these results show that young people can have fun and learn while training and continue to achieve results in competition."
